

CRITERIA FOR COMPLETION

**The client will have completed
the Adult Court Program
when he/she has:**

Court Ordered Diversion Program

- ◆ Completed his/her goals and objectives of the treatment plan.
- ◆ Remained drug/alcohol free for at least 60 consecutive days.
- ◆ Paid all fines and fees.
- ◆ Completed court sanctions.

Regular Outpatient Treatment Program

- ◆ All the above except paying of fines and completing court sanctions.

Results

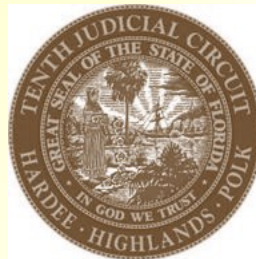
- ◆ For Court-Ordered clients, the charges will be dismissed from the client's permanent record.
- ◆ Improved family communication.
- ◆ A chance to start a drug and alcohol free life.

Polk County Drug Court Adult Treatment Program

(The State Attorney must refer
the client to Drug Court.)

The Misdemeanor Program

Is a minimum 4 month program. It is for
the first time offender with no violent crim-
inal record.

The Felony Program

Is a minimum of 12 month program using
the same modalities and treatment ap-
proach as the Misdemeanor except it is a
longer program.

The two placements listed in the next col-
umn are also used in addressing the same
issues. Progress reports will be sent to the
referral source. The client is expected to
pay for the services rendered by Drug
Court. Each client will receive an orienta-
tion, comprehensive assessment, place-
ment and treatment plan.

“Changing People, Places and Things” Two Placements

Intervention

Is psycho-education focusing on decision-
making, life skills, self-esteem & family
communication. The client will be
expected to participate in all program
activities; absences must have verifiable
excuse. There will be individual sessions,
frequent random drug screens and
Support Group meetings weekly, HIV/
AIDS education class and drug/alcohol
classes.

Substance Abuse and Chemical Dependency Treatment

Focuses on abstinence through individual
and group counseling, the 12-step model,
decision making skills, peer and family
relationships. Clients process the cause
and effects of substance abuse in their
lives. This placement includes individual
and group therapy, random drug screens,
Support Group meetings and HIV/AIDS
education class. Such topics are honesty,
positive thinking, trust, acceptance, self-
esteem, forgiveness and consequences of

What are the Requirements?

A written commitment from the client. Com-
pletion of his/her treatment plan. Compliance
with court sanctions.

**Regular Outpatient Services are pro-
vided for volunteer clients. No reports
are sent to a Judge or Prosecuting Attor-
ney. However, other referral sources
are given progress reports.**

***Length of time in program is dependent
upon individual participation, compliance
and progress in the program.***
